Children's Advocacy Looked After Children & Child Protection

An Advocate is an independent adult who will help a young person to have their opinions and views heard by people who make decisions about them, and ensure that these are taken seriously.

An advocate will **listen** to what you say.

An Advocate can help a young person **understand their rights**.



Advocacy is...

- Led by young people
- A confidential service
- Supporting young people to have their voice heard at conferences or meetings where decisions are made about them
- Enabling young people to work towards solutions to issues

Advocacy is not...

- Young people having no responsibility
- 'Us against Them'
- Mentoring or key working

How can an advocate be involved?

- Support you with a care review
- Attend a conference with you or for you
- Help you speak to your social worker or the Chair of your conference
- Talk to you about your rights
- Help you to complain if you're not happy about something to do with your care
